### **Michael Mair writes about the tour:**

This is a fantastic opportunity for young people (18-30) to walk in the footsteps of Jesus, and to explore for themselves the Israeli and Palestinian conflict. We will spend time visiting with Church of Scotland partners (Tabetha School, the House of Grace and the Tent of Nations to name a few) and see for ourselves the difference that these organisations are making in the land. During these visits we will have the opportunity to meet with individuals of all faiths who are living with the daily reality of conflict and hear their stories. We will also be visiting important pilgrimage sites, such as Bethlehem, Nazareth, the Jordan river, and Jerusalem. The trip will be led by the Rev. Michael Mair, and supported by two other experienced leaders. There will be 2 preparation days in advance of the trip, and a day for reflection following.

Staying in the Scots Hotel in Tiberias, and St Andrew's Guesthouse in Jerusalem, the tour will be of interest to anyone interested in exploring the realities of life in Israel and Palestine. Presbyteries are being asked to recommend young people to take part in this pilgrimage, and it is expected that they will also support participants financially, as they will become an excellent resource for the Presbytery in the future. The cost for each participant is £1,100, and contributions from the Presbytery will be reduced from this figure. The closing date for applications is 31 January 2019.
