

Property

Detached former church hall within the village of Lochailort. Surrounded by the beautiful west-coast Scottish countryside, the property is surrounded by sweeping hills and greenery.

Lochailort is around 26 miles from Fort William and lies at the head of Loch Ailort. It is a picturesque location and the hall is across the road from the local village Inn.

The hall sits on the roadside and is constructed in timber frame walls clad in corrugated iron. The roof is pitched and clad in corrugated iron. The hall consists of an entrance porch and main hall area.

Gross Internal Floor Area: 45 sqm or thereby

Grounds

The property sits on a small site on the roadside (A830). There is no parking available onsite.

Services

The hall has mains electricity only.

EPC

The hall is exempt from an Energy Performance Certificate due to the floor size being below the minimum required.





Planning

The Hall is not listed.

Local Area

Lochailort lies at the head of Loch Ailort, a sea loch, on the junction of the Road to the Isles (A830) between Fort William and Mallaig. It is served by Lochailort railway station on the West Highland Line. The Lochailort Inn is across the road from the property and Lochailort has a Local fish farm.

Arisaig is around 9 miles away and has a shop, cafe and hotel. Mallaig is 16 miles from the village and has a larger selection of shops, medical practice, primary and secondary schools. There are ferry connections to Skye, the Small Isles and South Uist.
