BOOKING CHECK-LIST

Remember to double check as many details as possible with your prospective speaker when making a booking!

It could be helpful to have the following information to hand:

- the date you'd like your speaker to come, or few dates in case one isn't suitable
- the time they need to be there, as well as when they'll start talking
- how long they should speak for
- when they should invite questions, if at all
- if there is a point in the meeting they can leave (if there is business for example)
- if they should bring any literature or items to sell or if there are any restrictions on this (i.e. raffle tickets)

Remember to ask:

- if the speaker requires you to confirm the booking in writing
- if payment and/or travel expenses are required
- if they require a parking space
- if they need directions, or a post-code for their sat nav
- if they require anything to show resources or items to sell, like a table or display board
- what technology requirements they have
- if they have any dietary requirements
- if there is a mobile number and email address you can contact them directly on in case there are any last minute problems!
