

Title	Exploring the Bible (going beyond Noah's Ark) (x1)	Lounge
Speaker	<b>Gavin Thomson</b> has worked for SU Scotland and associated trusts for the last 14 years, now working in West Lothian and Falkirk. He is married to Joanna and they have three children between the ages of 8 and 2.	
Blurb	Do we want to tell children Bible stories – or do we want to explore what say alongside children? This seminar will think about ways to get interprint children, to be challenged and changed, not just a Sunday school story.	
Title	The first five steps: how to start connecting with your community (x2)	Red Room
Speaker	Charlie Morris is an Aussie who now calls Scotland home, who loves his coffee, who has almost 30 years of paid and voluntary youth work experience, and spends the rest of his time leading Urban Saints in Scotland, an organisation committed to helping churches deliver great youth and children's work.	
Blurb	You have a passion and desire to see more children and young people in your church, but still are not sure where to start or what to do first. In this workshop we will creatively explore the first five steps you should take, why the order is important, and the significant role coffee will play in each step!	
Title	Answering Young People's Questions (x1)	Small Hall
Speaker	<b>Cara Wightman</b> is the senior development worker for Cathcart Youth Ministry Partnership (CYMP). CYMP is a charity set up in 2007 by three local churches to provide children and youth work. Cara is married to Mark and they have a daughter .	
Blurb	What do you do when your children or young people ask hard questions about God and faith? Panic? Fake a sneezing fit? Refer them to the minister? Believe it or not, the faith questions that bother people (of all ages) have all been asked many times, and sensible answers have been formulated by people much wiser than us! I will try to point you to these sources, in the Bible and elsewhere, but more importantly, we will explore together the importance of our own walk with God in equipping us with the wisdom and confidence to face the hardest and most personal questions of all.	
Title	Engaging with Schools (x2)	Sanctuary
Speaker	<b>Steve Younger</b> is the Baptist Minister at High Blantyre where he is now in his 30th year of ministry. He has been involved in School Chaplaincy for longer than that (Primary, Secondary, ASN, and ASD). He is currently studying for a PhD in Religious Observance and Spiritual Development.	
Blurb	Schools "the most significant single point of contact between the Church (J Caperon A Vital Ministry: Chaplaincy in Schools). This seminar explores School can work in partnership to fulfil the capacities of Scotland's Excellence' and provide meaningful assemblies and religious observance.	how Church and

Speaker	<b>Paula Morton</b> works as part of the Urban Saints Scotland team, working with churches helping leaders to deliver great youth & children's work. Not only can Paula be found running messy challenges at holiday clubs & camps, she also runs a flower business with her Mum.	
Blurb	A session for those seeking appropriate resources and ideas and help adapting them for effective use within your context and strategy. What resources are available for youth and children's work and how do I choose the right ones for my context? How do I adapt these resources to fit my group? This will be a practical, participatory session that aims to address these questions and will use as its base the "Energize" material from Urban Saints.	

Title	Not just a Holiday Club (x2)	Small Hall
Speaker	Cara Wightman—see above	
Blurb	Cara Wightman—see above A Holiday Club is a great mission opportunity and offers an exciting time for team members of all ages and stages to grow in faith, fellowship and service! But what about the other 51 weeks (98%) of the year? Surely there is more to do than simply recover from the last one and get ready for next year? We don't have all the answers but in this workshop we'll explore together some suggestions for keeping the momentum going in your community all year round, and making sure your helper team keeps growing.

Speaker	<ul> <li>Shuna Dicks has been Parish Minister at Aberlour Parish Church for almost 7 years. Messy Church has been part of the life of the parish for over 5 years, becoming a third congregation and regularly sees upwards of 30 people at monthly gatherings – most of whom are not 'Sunday' worshippers.</li> </ul>	
Blurb	We will look at how a Messy Church session runs, how we attract people to come along etc. This will be a very hands on session and there may be some mess! A variety of resources will be available for participants to look at as well as time for some questions.

In this seminar, we explore four distinct styles in which people encounter God, how these develop as we grow and how our own preferences impact on what we prepare for others.





Each year COSY offers several young adults the opportunity to travel overseas and represent the Church of Scotland by taking part in

The COSY Collective fund is a pot of money set aside for the use of young people in projects that enable them to creatively reach out to their communities. Small grants (normally up to £200) will be given to projects in local communities (not overseas) run by young people. Grants could be used for starting a new youth group, buying equipment, running a sports day event, starting a youth choir, buying resources for a bible study group, hiring transport to get to an event—the list is endless.

Any young person, involved in the Church of Scotland, aged 25 or younger can apply. Applications from individuals or groups will be accepted.
