The Forum seeks to fulfil instructions from the General Assembly of 2024 as follows:

- To reflect on the decline of the Church of Scotland and offer guidance on how to address it (jointly with Faith Action);
- To prepare a statement of apology for the Church's historical involvement with slavery (jointly with Faith Action and the Equality, Diversity and Inclusion group);
- To explore the views in the Church on assisted dying and report back to the General Assembly (jointly with Faith Action);
- To reconsider the Third Article Declaratory and how this may be interpreted given the radically changed landscape of the Church (jointly with the Assembly Trustees, Ecumenical Relations Committee and Legal Questions Committee);
- To produce a Book of Confessions, subject to approval under the Double Barrier Act at GA 2025;
- To reflect on the contemporary significance of the Council of Nicaea (jointly with the Ecumenical Relations Committee).
