Funeral for a woman with special needs who died suddenly at the age of 34

Introduction

Alison was a very special person.

She was special to her parents,.....,who've looked after her so well over the years.

She was special to her brothers and sisters,and to the whole family.

She was special to her friends at her centre and everywhere else.

And she was special to all those people, many of you here today, who've known her all her life, and to those of us who've known her as a friend and neighbour and someone we enjoyed being with.

It's heart-breaking to have to be here today doing this now, and there's no way of making it any easier, except to remember that God is with us, and that *Alison* was and is and always will be special, very special, to God as well. And for those of us who believe that there is a God, which I know can be very hard at times, there is absolutely no doubt that *Alison* is with God now.

Prayer:

God in heaven, you know how hard it is to believe in you on a day like this.

But we want to believe in you.

We want to believe there is more to life than what we see or hear or feel around us.

We want to believe that the life you give us continues beyond the narrow limits of our sight, and we want to know, most of all today, that *Alison* is with you now, safe and well, happy and at rest until we can all see each other again in your time and in your presence.

We want to believe this so that we can find some comfort in the deep hurt we feel now, so that we can know that the love we've felt for *Alison* and all the love and care that have been poured out on her, and all the love she herself has shown throughout her precious, special life, so that we can know that this has all been worthwhile and valuable in your sight as well as ours, so that we can know that this love has not been wasted but has made *Alison* herself happy, and has helped to make us all better people.

So, God who has been with *Alison* and her family and all who've been so much part of her life, don't desert us now when we need to know you're there and we need to feel, now more than ever, your love and understanding, your comfort and your strength.

And where we can't easily feel your love like this,
where we cannot find our way to this kind of faith,
give us at least the comfort of the love and care
of our family and our friends around us today,
that in the holiness of purely human grace and kindness
we might find some solace and some help.

And bring peace to Alison today, as we gather so reluctantly and painfully
to place her soul into your arms.

Bless her soul who has been for us the light and joy of so many happy days,
who made us laugh and smile, who has drawn out of us
so much love and care and compassion
by the love and care and compassion that she always had within her.

And be with us, your people here, who need your love and comfort now
more than we have ever needed it before, because we pray for this in Jesus' name, Amen.

We thank you for who she's been and what she's meant to us
as a very special daughter and sister and aunt,
as one who enjoyed her friendships and gave so much love as a friend to others.
We thank you for the sign Alison has been to us of your love,
for the life she lived that has not offended you as much as we so often do,
that has not damaged your loving purposes as we habitually do,
that she has lived her life on earth with an innocence and goodness
we would all do well to learn from.
We have treasured Alison as we know you know and understand.

We will never forget her and we know that because of her we are different people now,
and different for the better too.
We are jealous of your presence with her now, and can't deny that.
We wish she were still here with us.
But help us to know that she is safely in your company now
and that you're enjoying her as much as we have ever done.
Thank you for leaving us with memories, that are so good and warm and happy.

And give us any strength you can just now, Lord.
Give us any faith we're capable of holding on to.
And give to us all the love for each other that Alison drew out of us all
and we're all going to need to see us through the lives that lie ahead of us.
Let us, in our lives now, continue to be true friends, for there are those who trust us.
